Read this passage carefully: John 14:1–11. Whenever you study the Bible it is always good to ask these questions about the passage:

- What do we learn about God?
- What do we learn about people?
- What does God want me to ask or think from this passage?

You might want to ask these questions too:

- Why did the people wave palm branches?
- > What does Hosanna mean?
- What prophecy was Jesus fulfilling?

Actions


Take time to worship Jesus. Choose a song to worship God with (perhaps one with the word Hosanna in it) and as you worship find something you can wave to God – it may be a branch from a tree, a handkerchief or something else. Whatever you choose to wave, think of a special meaning that that object represents as you wave it to God. For example – the palm branches were a sign of victory and a reminder that God had come to live with them (Jews used palm branches to make their shelters in the feast of tabernacles, a reminder that life here is temporary, but life with God is for ever.)

GROUP ACTIVITY: HIDDEN IN THE CROWD

Make a paper palm leaf and take it in turns to hide it around your house while the rest of the family has to try and find it. If they are getting closer say warmer, if they are getting further away from it say colder.

GO AND DO IT: RECREATE IT

Using card see if you can make your own model of the journey Jesus took on the donkey. Search on the internet for, 'palm Sunday donkey craft.'

EPISODE 12: HE BECAME SIN

DISCUSS

- What did you discover from today's podcast?
- In what way was Jesus different to us, that he could become our sin?
- What are sins?
- Where are your sins now?

go deeper

These Bible verses were mentioned in today's podcast.

- 2 Corinthians 5:21
- Romans 3:23
- John 3:16
- 1 John 2:1-2

Read this passage carefully: 2 Corinthians 5:21. Whenever you study the Bible it is always good to ask these questions about the passage:

- What do we learn about God?
- What do we learn about people?
- What does God want me to ask or think from this passage?

You might want to ask these questions too:

- > We give Jesus our sin, what does he give us?
- What does it mean to be in Christ?

ACTIONS

Write a list of sins (or draw pictures), then take all those sins and staple them to a paper cross. Take time to say sorry to God for the things you have done wrong, then read 2 Corinthians 5:21 – remember we now have Jesus' goodness! If you have outdoor space and a metal bin why not take the sins on the cross and burn them.


GROUP ACTIVITY: TONGUE TWISTER

See how fast you can say these tongue twisters (look up some more on the internet or even try to make up your own).

GO AND DO IT: CREATIVE PAINTING

Paint a picture of Jesus becoming our sin so that we can be right with God. You may choose to paint a picture of Jesus on the cross, or it may be more of a mix of colours that express the feelings of what God has done. Whatever you choose to do, give it a go and be bold and free as you paint.

DISCUSS

- What did you discover from today's podcast?
- Talk about some of the scars that you have and the stories they tell.
- Which of Jesus' scars makes you think the most and why?

These Bible verses were mentioned in today's podcast.

- John 19:1–7
- John 19:31–37
- Isaiah 53:1–12

Read this passage carefully: John 19:31–37. Whenever you study the Bible it is always good to ask these questions about the passage:

- > What do we learn about God?
- What do we learn about people?
- What does God want me to ask or think from this passage?

You might want to ask these questions too:

- Do you know why the mix of blood and water proved that Jesus was already dead?
- Read Exodus 12:46 and Zechariah 12:10. How did Jesus fulfil these prophecies in this passage?
- Look up how many years before Jesus died Zechariah prophesied.


ACTIONS

Jesus' scars tell a story – that God's goodness is now available for us. Is there any one you know who needs God's forgiveness? Is there anyone you know who needs healing? Pray for them now and expect God to answer.

GROUP ACTIVITY: MARK A STORY

- Measure each person against a wall and make a mark in pencil with their name and the date. Come back later to see how they have grown.
- Think of all the big dates in your life (being born, starting school, meeting Jesus). Find a big stick and cut a mark into it one for each date in your life so far. Leave lots of space to add more marks to your life stick.

EPISODE 14: LIFE IS IN THE BLOOD

DISCUSS

- What did you discover from today's podcast?
- What was the point of sacrifices in the Old Testament?
- Why is the blood of Jesus so important?

go deeper

These Bible verses were mentioned in today's podcast.

- Mark 14:23–25
- John 19:34
- Colossians 2:17
- Hebrews 9:11-14

Read this passage carefully: John 19:28–30. Whenever you study the Bible it is always good to ask these questions about the passage:

- > What do we learn about God?
- What do we learn about people?
- What does God want me to ask or think from this passage?

You might want to ask these questions too:

- Jesus said, 'it is finished!' What is finished?
- Write down three things that Jesus' death on the cross did for us.

ACTIONS

Take communion together as a family. Explain how the wine/juice reminds us of the blood of Jesus (reassure your children it's not actual blood). You may also want to sing some songs about the blood of Jesus. For example:


- There is power, power, wonder working power.
- Nothing but the blood of Jesus.
- > 0 the blood.
- The blood will never lose its power.

Make your own hot cross buns (or ask your local shop to make some for you) then share a feast together.

ACTIONS


Because of what Jesus has done it is time for a praise party! Create your own praise chant and use it to shout praise to God as loud as you can.
